


Dublin City Council is the Local Government / Municipal Authority for Dublin City. Dublin City Council has 63 democratically elected public representatives headed by the Lord Mayor.

Dublin City Council executive is responsible for the delivery of essential public services to the citizens of the city, including planning, social housing, public libraries and parks. Dublin City Council employs over 6,000 staff.








How does your organization's expertise contribute to the REGEN project's goals of paving the way toward sustainable and lasting people-centric neighbourhood regeneration through the development of an Assessment Framework for Urban Regeneration (AFUR)?

Dublin City Council is the Planning Authority for Dublin City. We are responsible for the delivery of public infrastructure and community projects in the city. Dublin City Council has identified the Demo site at Ringsend and Poolbeg Peninsula as one of our Decarbonising Zones in our Climate Action Plan: Climate Neutral Dublin 2030. The Decarbonising Zone will support the objectives of the REGEN project.








How do you see your organization's participation in neighbourhood regeneration offices (NRO) and the REGEN toolbox development?

Dublin City Council has identified an office space in the demo site that is suitable for the Neighbourhood Regeneration Office and REGEN Toolbox development. Dublin City Council has agreed to open and deploy staff in the NRO.

The NRO will provide information to the public on the REGEN project and other European projects in the city, energy-saving tips, energy upgrades and available grants, and sustainable transport solutions.
