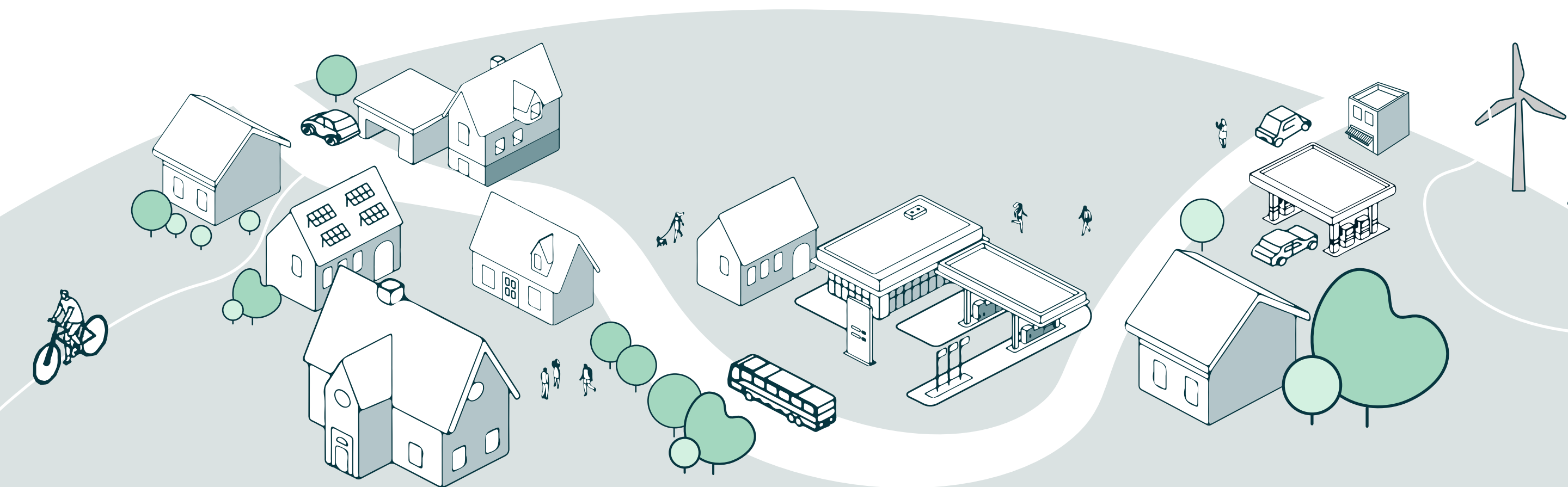
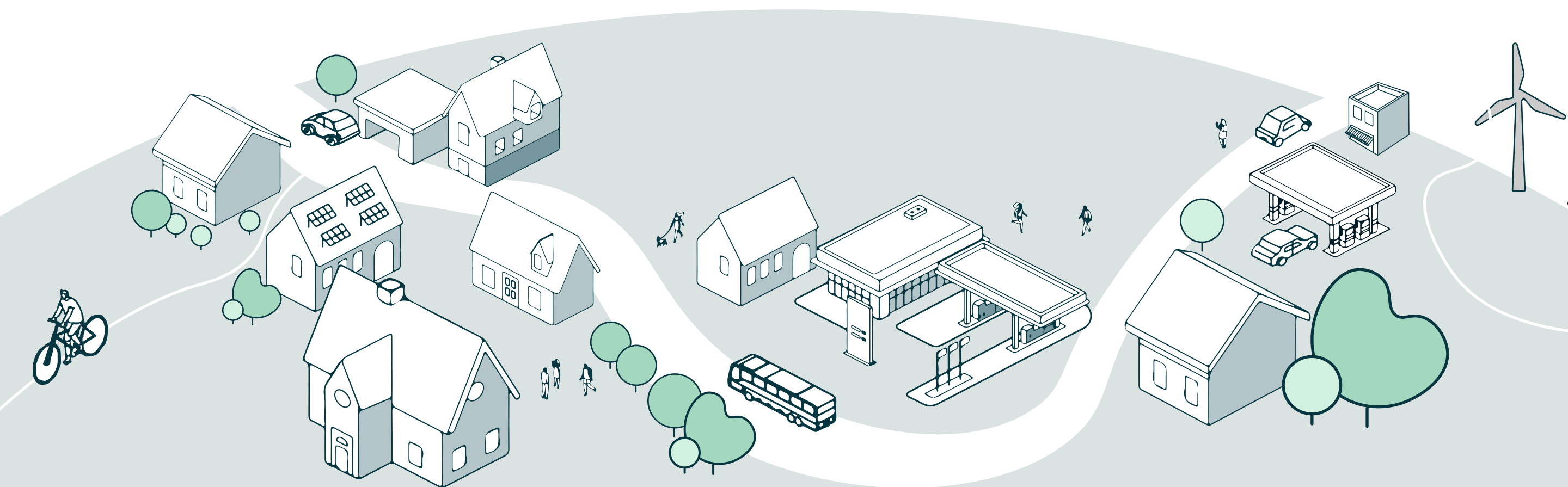

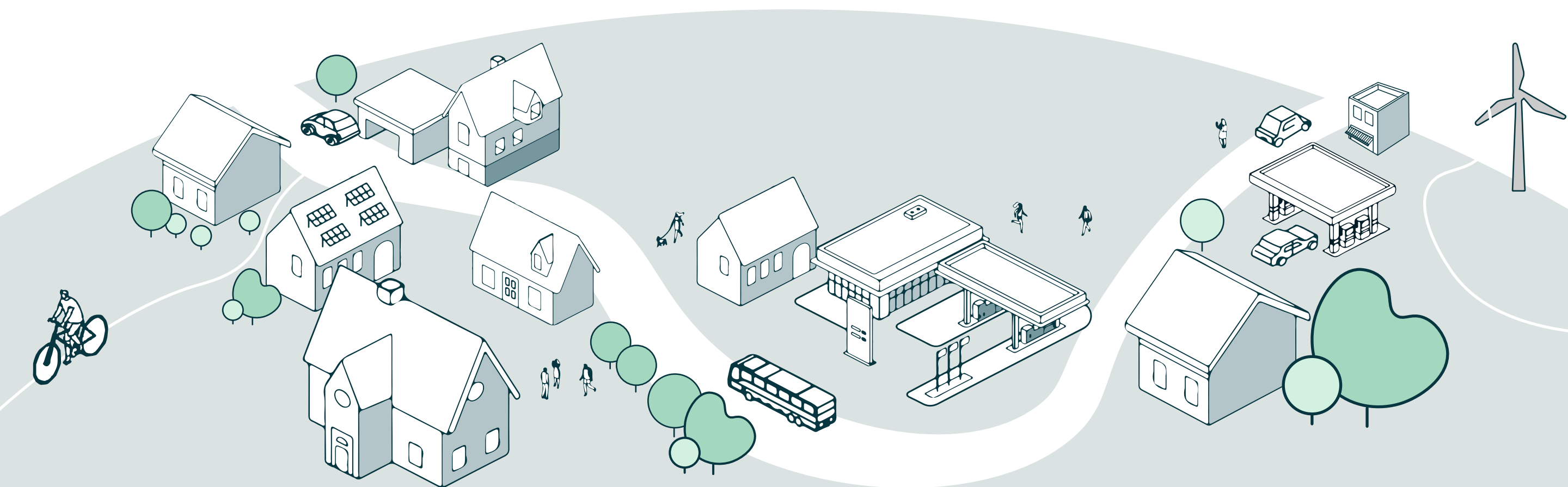
Can you introduce your organization?

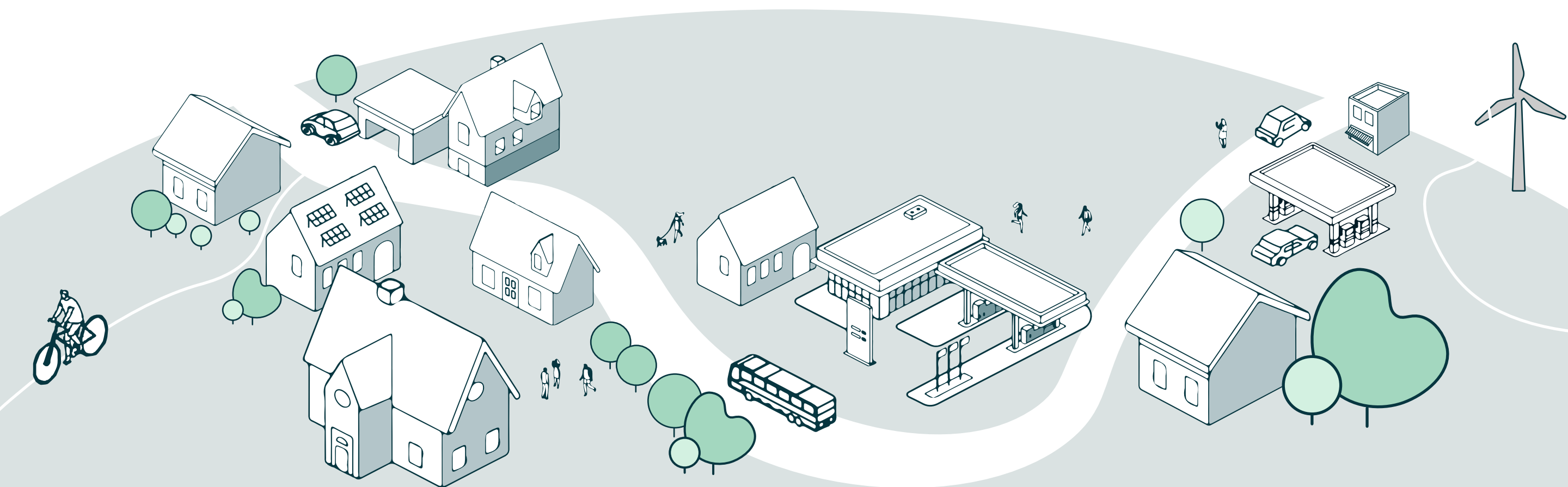

What specific challenges do you anticipate in developing or applying an Assessment Framework for Urban Regeneration (AFUR)?

Urban regeneration is a broad concept that encompasses many different strategies and actions that are often hyper-local. Adopting a common language to compare efforts across territories is crucial for inferring lessons and identifying the most relevant solutions in a given context. The AFUR will have to maintain flexibility to local contexts while still providing a standard, replicable framework.
