




## Can you introduce your organization?

KAW takes a holistic approach to sustainability, considering energy efficiency, material impact, nature inclusion, and social needs.










What specific challenges do you anticipate in developing or applying an Assessment Framework for Urban Regeneration (AFUR)?

The challenge is to translate the generic AFUR into a context-sensitive, pragmatic, and purposeful version—one that is both flexible and provides strong guidance.










What role will your team play in developing strategies to improve urban planning best practices through neighbourhood regeneration interventions?
